

Laminate Floors Maintenance & Care Guide



1. Daily Cleaning & General Care

Dust & Dirt Removal

Sweep or vacuum regularly using a soft broom or a vacuum cleaner without a beater bar to prevent scratching.

• Damp Mopping

Clean using a damp mop (not wet). Use a neutral pH laminate floor cleaner. Avoid excessive water and do not use abrasive or wax-based cleaners.

Spill Management

Although the flooring is waterproof, we recommend cleaning spills immediately to prevent seepage into joints or edges.

2. What to Avoid

- Do **not** leave standing water on the floor.
- Do **not** use abrasive pads, steel wool, or harsh chemicals.
- Avoid dragging heavy or sharp objects directly on the floor.
- Do **not** wax or polish the floor.



3. Furniture & Surface Protection

- Use **felt pads or rubber caps** on furniture legs to prevent scratches.
- Always **lift** furniture when moving it—never drag.
- For wheeled chairs or furniture, use **soft rubber wheels** and protective mats when necessary.

4. Environmental Conditions

- Recommended Temperature: $59^{\circ}F 86^{\circ}F (15^{\circ}C 30^{\circ}C)$
- Recommended Humidity: 40% 70%
- Maintain proper ventilation and avoid direct exposure to strong sunlight.

5. Periodic Maintenance Schedule

Task	Frequency	Notes
Sweeping/Vacuumin	g Daily or as needed	Prevents buildup of dust and grit
Damp Mopping	1–2 times per week	Use soft mop and neutral cleaner
Deep Cleaning	Every 3 months	Use specialized laminate floor cleaner
Edge Inspection	Every 6 months	Check for signs of lifting or separation



6. Additional Notes

- Do not apply floor wax or polish.
- Use breathable, non-rubber-backed mats to avoid moisture trapping.
- Damaged planks can usually be replaced individually—contact us for service.
